Never stopping to ask for directions

You're 500 miles from civilization, your gas gauge reads less than a quarter of a tank, and you're not sure if you went the right way at that last fork. An exit ramp appears ahead. There's no sign, but you haven't seen one for more than 200 miles. You don't see a gas station, but maybe there's one down the road. Is it worth the risk to exit here and search for a gas station or do you continue on the highway, which you're not sure is taking you where you want to go, and hope a sign appears?

In-car navigation systems are helping to prevent this from happening. Using geographic information system (GIS) and global positioning system (GPS) technologies can tell you where you are, where you're going, and where you've been. They can also tell you where the next hotel, restaurant, or gas station is.
